Phillips created an affected category of students by first determining there were 52 degree-seeking students who were enrolled in on-campus courses moved to an online format due to the pandemic.
	The seminary calculated the per credit hour disbursement to the affected students at \$31.55799 by dividing the \$7,211 aid amount by the total number of enrolled credit hours moved online.
	EXAMPLE: A student who was enrolled in a three credit-hour on campus course subsequently moved to an online format would receive \$94.67.
