

Master's Course Schedule for Summer 2022

TH 565 The Cross, the Lynching Tree, and the Theology of James H. Cone (3 hrs.)

Instructor: Dr. Raymond Carr (http://www.raymondcarr.com) Intensive: June 13 - 17 This course will contextualize *The Cross and the Lynching Tree*, a book that may be considered the "Coda," the final movement, of James Hal Cone's contributions to Black Theology. To best understand the theology of Dr. Cone, we will explore the hermeneutical and sociopolitical horizons of his thought within his early beginnings in the Civil Rights Movement to the end of his life's work in the twenty-first century.

AH 545 Native American Cosmologies, Creation and Being Human (3 hrs.)

Instructor: Dr. Lisa Dellinger

This course is a survey of Native American cosmologies/spiritualities as compared with the US culturally christian worldview. Native American Studies resources, giving special emphasis to Indigenous writings, are placed in conversation with texts regarding euro-american christian history and theologies. The human being's relationship with nature is interrogated by analyzing concepts like theological anthropology, interdependence, creation, reciprocity, settler colonialism, commodification, exploitation, and salvation. This course meets: On campus Tuesday - Friday from 8:30 am – 5:00 pm; Pre-Class Synchronous Meeting on Thursday, June 16 (7:15 pm – 9:15 pm CST); Post-Intensive Synchronous Meeting on Thursday, June 30 (7:15 pm – 9:15 pm CST); Asynchronous Lecture available Thursday, June 30. Instructor approval required to enroll.
